


ICHA News Spring 2019

An electronic survey was emailed to all University Hills residents in January. The goal of the survey was to gather big picture views about life in University Hills, including the physical elements, the social programs and interactions, household configuration, ICHA management's performance and building community.

Survey Results




ICHA, along with resident volunteers, developed the survey with input from the Homeowner Representative Board, ICHA Board members, ICHA management, ICHA staff, and University Hills residents.

The survey response rate exceeded expectations, at 489 responses (representing over 20% of the community). In the weeks and months ahead, a more in-depth analysis of the survey results will be translated into newsletter articles identifying trends from the data. Mail Delivery in University Hills

To avoid probate, make sure a deed is recorded transferring your property into trust when you execute your family trust. Due to the Ground Sublease, it is also necessary to transfer your ground sublease interest into the family trust.

Trash Talk

Trash bins at Alturas, Los Trancos, Las Lomas and Santiago apartment properties are for exclusive use by residents of those apartment communities. There have been recent occasions where dumpsters have been overloaded with bulky items. We ask that everyone be thoughtful about disposing of trash properly:

- Do not place any trash on the ground next to the trash bins. Cardboard boxes must be broken down prior to placing in the recycle bins.
- Large, oversized, bulky items should not be placed in the trash bins. Please contact the Rental Department at 824-6254 to arrange for a special pick-up.
- Homeowners are reminded that Waste Management provides four free curbside pickups for oversized items per year.



Got Insurance?

All University Hills residents are required to carry insurance protecting their home or personal belongings.

Homeowners: Required to carry insurance covering 90% of the value of the home.

Renters: Liability coverage is required and personal property is recommended. Contact the rental department for the required coverage limits.

Condo Owners: HO-6 coverage is recommended.



Street Sweeping Protects the Ocean

Street sweeping is the first line of defense preventing debris and pet waste from traveling to the ocean. Please move your car off the street every 2nd and 4th Thursday of the month to allow street sweepers to clean the gutters.
